Lessons/Challenges

- Raise awareness through special days campaigns
- Interest more in tree planting than GROWING; growing needs care and monitoring
- Vandalism of planted trees especially in unfences schools especially in urban settings – people uproot to resell the seedlings
- Floods, Dry spells all impact tree growing efforts
