From **Monday 5th March – Monday 19th March** schools across Scotland will be taking part in our **#BuyMalawian2018** campaign.

In the lead up to **Dr David Livingstone's 205**th **birthday**, we're encouraging our school members to host a **Malawian Tea Party**!

The Malawian Tea Party will help raise awareness of your Malawi link within your school and local community, and help promote Malawian products available to buy in Scotland.

There's also a holiday to Malawi to be won...

Why is this important?

Malawi operates at a trade-deficit, meaning it imports more products than it exports.

It's hoped that by creating a market for Malawian products in Scotland (and other countries), it will help increase the economic development of the country.





Fairtrade Fortnight

Monday 26th Feb - Sunday 11th March

Why not learn about the products during Fairtrade Fortnight then serve the same products at your tea party? (Please note, not all Malawian products are Fairtrade, full details on our website)

Did you know that there are lots of Malawian products available in the UK and purchasing them directly benefits the lives of people in Malawi?

It's really easy to take part! Just follow the steps below:

1. Pick a date for your Malawian Tea Party

- This can be anytime between Monday 5th March Monday 19th March.
- Why not host your tea party during Fairtrade Fortnight & combine Fairtrade Fortnight with the Buy Malawian Challenge?

2. Choose the type of Tea Party you would like to host

- **Staffroom**: teachers only teas, coffee, cookies, why not try a famous Malawian gin and tonic (If suitable for the location of your staff tea party!)
- Classroom: teach a lesson on Malawi, decorate flags, take the JTS 90kg rice challenge!
