Shaping Our Future Foundation

was officially registered on 6th August 2020 with the Registrar General. The Foundation is also registered with all the relevant regulatory bodies in Malawi including the NGO Board, Council for Non-Governmental Organizations (CONGOMA) and the Malawi Revenue Authority (MRA).

Our work aims at supporting Government efforts for a better Malawi. We aim to ensure that all Malawians especially rural women and girls prosper and realize their potential. We will work with Government partners, NGOs, community structures, women and

girls and all Malawians who share the vision of an inclusive and prosperous Malawi.

Shaping Our Future Foundation is in pursuit of a bold vision for "a holistic citizen empowered for social impact through emancipation from a difficult childhood in the village or on the streets." For the next five years, Shaping Our Future Foundation will strategically be working to increase the enrolment, retention, and completion of secondary school education of 5,000 village girls by 31st December 2026.

The enablers we believe will make a huge impact within Shaping Our Future Foundation and launch us toward our vision of success include:

- 1. Financial Sustainability through development of a Resource Mobilization Strategy and recruitment of a Resource Mobilization Officer. Internal controls will also be strengthened to ensure prudent management of financial and material resources.
- 2. Strengthening Institutional Development and Good Governance by developing operational policy documents and ensuring that there is political will and unity of purpose among the Directors and Members.
- 3. Establish and Strengthen Partnerships through the core value of partnership. We therefore plan to strengthen relationships with existing partners while at the same time exploring and engaging new partners.
- 4. Effective Communication by establishing and implementing a local internet system. We will strengthen our publicity by ensuring that there are regular updates to staff and stakeholders/donors while ensuring that our staff have improved communication skills.
- 5. Develop Strong Human Capital through the setting up of a professional secretariat and development of tailor-made work policies including, HR, Financial, Procurement.
- 6. Strong Programme Development by creating a blueprint of programme design in the four thematic areas and create SOFF District / National Structures.
