#### Log In

Step 1: Click here.

## **Update Your Profile**

All active members of the Scotland Malawi Partnership will be able to update their own profile. Once you have completed the Log-In steps above, you will be able to edit all aspects of your profile. To do this:

**Step 1:** <u>Sign in</u> and click on "Edit Profile" in the green box to the right of the page above "Location in Malawi"

**Step 2:** Edit your details on that page. If you make any changes, please make sure you click "Save Profile" at the bottom of the page otherwise your edits will be lost.



#### **Use the Online Forums**

**Step 1:** <u>Click here to sign in</u> – you will not be able to post a comment in the online forums unless you are a member of the Scotland Malawi Partnership. If you are not a member, or are not signed in, you will only be able to view the posts, but not comment on them.

**Step 2:** Hover your mouse over "Our Members" on the navigation bar on the website and click on "Online Forums" which will appear in a drop-down menu.



All of the online forums are categorized under each Area of Partnership.

**Step 3:** Click on the Area of Partnership you are interested in posting a comment in or replying to. (example used is Faith-Based)

**Step 4:** You can then (1) click on a message to reply to it OR (2) post your own message by following the on-screen instructions. You can also (3) sign up to receive email alerts when another user posts a comment on that particular forum.



### **Update your Partnership Principles**

<u>Click here to sign in</u> (you must be logged in to complete the principles). Partnership Principles can be found on the Home Page and under "Who We Are" and "Get Involved" on the navigation bar. Similarly to the Online Forums, hover over these headings to view a drop-down menu and click on Partnership Principles.



The 11 Partnership Principles are paramount to our work as an organisation. To help our members develop and strengthen their partnerships, we've created a private area of the website where members can reflect on their partnership and understand areas in which they can focus on to enhance their links with Malawi. **Only the SMP office and each individual member (when logged in)** will be able to see your selections.

Clicking on each Principle will reveal an interactive information area, where you will be able to:

- 1. Download PDF's to help support that Principle
- 2. Watch a short video clip by an SMP or MaSP member speaking about that Principle
- Reflect on your own partnership by clicking on one of the three options: Going well, Could do differently, or Priority area.



You will be able to change your options as you develop each Principle. Don't be afraid of choosing Priority area for some of your Principles - a good mix of green, orange and red is completely healthy!
